MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents, Carers and Students

Welcome to the last week of Term 1.

This term has been incredibly full with so many initiatives and activities taking place, especially the last 3 weeks. Our Year 12 students have been through an assessment period in this time as they continue to work towards their Higher School Certificate. The assessment time was busy for them; however, many students are telling me that they were happy with the work they have done and are feeling on track in terms of where they are up to in their learning journey this year.

Last week was the first formation day for the nine students from St Peter's who are headed to World Youth Day in Lisbon, Portugal later this year. The day was attended by all the pilgrims from across our Diocese and it was wonderful to share the excitement of all of the students and young adults as they prepare for this amazing experience.

Year 7 had a very successful camp last week, thankfully the weather held off for them after a wet start on the first day. I visited the camp during the week and the students and teachers I spoke with were having a wonderful time. It is always inspiring to watch our students combat and overcome their fears and apprehensions as they attempt some of the more challenging experiences on camp. Year 8 are on camp this week and we keep them in our thoughts and prayers as they take part in a wide range of adventure and challenge activities. I wish to offer my sincere thanks to all the staff who go to camp, it is a busy and very tiring few days. St Peter's staff never give anything less than their best in the way they look after your sons and daughters while they are away on experiences like camp.

I further extend my thanks to all our staff for everything that has been achieved this term and the tireless efforts that staff give to ensure the best learning and the best experiences for our young people.

Holy Week

During this last week of term, let us not forget about the significance of this week for us as Catholics. This week is Holy Week, it commenced on Sunday with Palm Sunday and concludes on Holy Saturday. The purpose of this week is to not only to commemorate, but also to re-enact and participate in the events leading up to Jesus' crucifixion on Good Friday.

On Palm Sunday we celebrated the triumphant entry of Jesus into Jerusalem. The people laid palms before him, a gesture that is only reserved for significant leaders. Tomorrow we will celebrate the last supper, the final Passover meal that Jesus shared with his disciples and the meal that forms the basis of our sacrament of Eucharist. It was on Holy Thursday that Jesus was betrayed and then arrested. The mass which occurs in parishes on Holy Thursday is one of the most beautiful liturgies of the year as the priest washes the feet of parishioners just as Jesus did to his disciples on this night.

The greatest focus of the week is the Passion and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Good Friday, the day that Jesus died, is commemorated in two ceremonies, "Stations of the Cross" which tells the story of the events leading to Jesus' crucifixion. This ceremony is usually held in the morning. In the afternoon, normally ay 3pm, is the Good Friday liturgy consisting of the reading of passion story and then veneration of the cross. On this occasion churches are stripped of all decorations and the altar is left bare. Mass is never celebrated on Good Friday.

It is on Easter Sunday that Jesus rises from the tomb and the masses on Easter Sunday are filled with rejoicing and celebration. Churches are re-decorated, music starts again and a sense of joy is apparent in all congregations.

Can I encourage everyone to think about attending your parish over the upcoming Easter weekend. Check your parish websites for the times of the various ceremonies. If you have not attended Holy Thursday mass or the Good Friday celebrations in the past, these are truly beautiful ceremonies and quite different from our normal Sunday Masses. The atmosphere in the church is different on each of these days and it is very special to participate in the entire journey.

I wish all families a very happy and holy Easter and a restful school holiday period.



Procedures for Early Departures from school

As a reminder to all families when needing to collect a student early from school (anything before 3.10pm), families need to provide a paper note to the student affected by the early departure (in the case of siblings, all students affected will require a separate note), to bring to school OR parents need to email the Student Services team using the email address below:

sspctstudentservices@dbb.catholic.edu.au

Students will need to present their early departure note, signed by their parent to their Leader of Wellbeing or Assistant Leader of Wellbeing on the day of departure, who will initial the note and return to your student. Your student will then use this note to show their classroom teacher at the time of departure.

Please do not enter partial notes into Compass as this interferes with attendance and rolls for the day.

Please enter only full day absences into Compass.
