


An assembly will be held to inform students of this new practice, which will commence in Term 2, Week 2.

ANIMATION WORKSHOP AT GOSFORD GALLERY

A group of Stage 5 Visual Arts Students attended an excursion to the Gosford Regional Gallery for a wonderful hands-on workshop on Thursday 22 June, introducing students to stop motion drawing animation.

The experience related to the current William Kentridge Art Exhibition and the work of contemporary artist Todd Fuller.

Students set up an incredibly sturdy camera rig. These were securely taped to the benches to minimise movement whilst they captured their images. They then engaged with creating a stop motion animated drawing of an apple or a pear, that was then consumed and transformed into something new. This required very careful observational drawing, the consumption of an apple and the ability to alter their drawing a minimum of 300 times. The results were fantastic!

Other creative activities in Visual Arts have involved the exploration of mark making. Students made a variety of mark making tools from sticks, leaves and feathers collected from the school grounds. They put them to the test to explore the use of expressive line using ink and charcoal on large pieces of paper.

It was very enjoyable to work outside with new materials and see our students immersed in a new experience.





TECHNOLOGY & APPLIED STUDIES

The first semester has been a very busy one in the TAS department. As usual, students across the stages and subject areas have created some amazing projects and engaged in a wide range of 'design thinking' activities.

In Stage 4, students have applied the knowledge and skills learned across the four context areas, to a diverse selection of practical activities in Food/Agriculture, Digital Technologies, Materials Technologies and the Engineering Systems

From the Sphero Robotics challenge in Digital Technologies to the Pizzeria Café and the Timber Planter Box in the Food/Agriculture class, or the CO² Dragster, Computer Aided Drafting (CAD) and 3D printing tasks in Engineering class, students have continued the 'taster' process that underpins Mandatory Technology in Stage 4.

Students in Stage 5 are almost halfway through the first rollout of the 100 hour courses. Teachers, across the subject area, have developed new and exciting courses to deliver to our Year 9 and 10 students.

From Timber, Textiles, Building Construction, Graphics and Metal Technologies to Food Technology and Information and Software Technology; students have designed, measured, drawn, cut, bent, folded, joined, sewed, weighed, mixed, and cooked their way through some engaging and challenging teaching and learning activities.

Stage 6 students have been busy working their way through the senior subject areas and are fast approaching the trial examination period of the courses. Our Industrial Technology Timber and Graphics students and the Textiles and Design students are heavily focussed on the completion of their Major Projects and their Design Folios. This is always a massive undertaking and such a fine achievement when finished. Our IPT, SDD and Food Technology students are building on their knowledge and understanding of course content as they prepare for the upcoming trial examinations.

A big thankyou to all the TAS staff and our students for a very productive Semester 1. We are looking forward to more exciting and innovative teaching and learning activities in the second half of the year. Good luck to our Year 12 students as they approach a very important phase of their educational journey.
