MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents, Carers and Students

The use of mobile phones and technology in schools has been a highly debated topic in recent times, both in Australia and overseas. In NSW, many schools have implemented full bans on mobile phones both during class and break times, while still allowing students to carry phones to and from school. Schools are reporting varied levels of success in managing these bans both in class and on school grounds with some schools finding the increased workload in policing the bans unmanageable.

At St Peter's the issue of mobile phones in class has been raised and talked about significantly, especially since returning from COVID lockdowns. We are aware that most of the inappropriate usage of phones is occurring outside school hours, and so full bans at school will not help with this. However, phones can also be a major distraction from learning within the classroom if allowed to be used freely.

Studies have shown the positive impacts of mobile phone bans in schools. One study conducted in 2016, found that banning mobile phones led to an increase in student performance, with test scores improving by 6.4% of a standard deviation. Similar studies from Spain and Norway also supported these findings.

It is the in-class usage that distracts students from learning that we focus on at St Peter's. Phones are banned in our classrooms, unless the teacher has a valid and beneficial educational reason for asking students to use their phone. We have a very clear mobile phone policy which states:

"3.1.3 Mobile phones are not to be used by students during class time unless the supervising teacher gives permission to do so."

It is crucial to acknowledge the issue of mobile phone separation and engage in open discussions about the negative effects of phone addiction.

Parents and caregivers can use various strategies to help minimise the impact of such bans whilst safeguarding their child's mental health and wellbeing. Maintaining open communication with your school is essential.

We have not been as focused on break times as we are not seeing significant issues in the playground with phones.

This month SchoolTV has published a special report on mobile phone anxiety which is becoming more prevalent as students are asked to turn phones off and put them away.

For parents concerned about mobile phone separation anxiety in their children, it is important to acknowledge it as a real issue and discuss the negative effects of phone addiction, such as sleep problems and mental health issues. Gradually introducing phone-free periods at home, setting clear expectations and boundaries and modelling healthy behaviours can help your child cope. It is also crucial to establish a support network and seek professional help if needed. Implementing mobile phone bans in schools allows for better focus on teaching and learning, minimising distractions and interruptions.

This Special Report will help address mobile phone separation anxiety and provide guidance on supporting your child's wellbeing as they try to reduce their reliance on mobile phones. We are still monitoring playground time and we will extend our policy to cover the playground if we deem the risk of harm to students is increasing. For now, we welcome any feedback you may have regarding mobile phone usage at school.

YEAR 12 PHYSICS KICKSTART EXCURSION


On the morning of Friday the 2nd of June, a group of enthusiastic senior Physics students embarked on a memorable excursion to the University of Sydney. The objective of this enlightening trip was to foster a spirit of experimentation and collaboration in Physics by joining forces with other schools in our Diocese and pooling our knowledge to take part in a number of exciting Physics workshops.

At the School of Physics at Sydney University, our students were treated with hands-on activities, each one carefully designed to directly relate to their Physics syllabus. From determining the width of a human hair with lasers to building functioning models of transformers and electrical motors, every experiment allowed us to apply theoretical concepts to tangible phenomena. Working alongside students from other schools, we embraced the power of collaboration, exchanging ideas and learning from each other's unique perspectives.

The highlight of the excursion was undoubtedly the opportunity to witness mind-boggling demonstrations by renowned members of the university. St Peter's Catholic College is offering a program that aims to help you and your adolescent manage the many emotional challenges of this stage of life. "Tuning In To Teens" is a sixweeks parenting program run once a week for two hours.

The program will teach you how to manage your own and adolescent's emotions in way that will help you to remain close and keep communicating. By learning these skills, you are less likely to have as much conflict within your family and your teen is more likely to talk to you about the challenging issues they face. These are factors that have been found to reduce the risk of mental health and substance abuse problems.

Limited places are available, priority will be given to those parents that register first. Please note that to get the most benefit out of the program, we recommend you commit to attend each week.
