

Dear Parents and Students

As we near the end of the academic year, I wanted to take a moment to highlight an often-underestimated factor in student success: attendance.



The Foundation of Learning

Attendance is the bedrock upon which a student's educational journey is built. It's not just about being physically present; it's about being mentally engaged, participating in discussions, and actively developing knowledge. Regular attendance helps students stay on track with their coursework, ensures they don't miss vital information, and allows them to form strong connections with their teachers and peers. The Education Act of 1990 requires students at school no less than 90% of the school year. This equates to up to 20 days off per year. Absences need to be explained no less than 5 days after the absence.



The Domino Effect

A consistent attendance record has a ripple effect on a student's overall academic performance. Regular attendance leads to better understanding of material, improved retention, and increased likelihood of achieving higher grades. It also cultivates a sense of responsibility, time management, and discipline, skills that are invaluable both in academia and in life beyond the classroom.



Fostering a Supportive Environment

At St Peter's we are dedicated to providing a nurturing environment that encourages students to flourish. We understand that life can throw curveballs, and challenges may arise. If you or your child are facing circumstances that are affecting attendance, please don't hesitate to reach out to us. Together, we can explore solutions and provide the necessary support. School Refusal is usually a symptom of poor mental health please alert us to the issue and seek support from your GP and counselling.



Parental Partnership

We firmly believe that the partnership between parents and the school is crucial in fostering consistent attendance. We encourage open communication, and we're here to listen, support, and work together for the best interest of your child's education.



Beyond the Classroom

Consistent attendance not only impacts academic success but also sets the stage for future endeavours. It instils a sense of commitment, accountability, and work ethic that will serve students well in their future careers.

Legalities

When attendance drops below the 90% rate at any time through the school year The Australian Government requires us to address the issue with you. In the first instance your child will receive a Compass entry alerting you to the issue. If the pattern continues a letter will be sent via email, highlighting the concerning pattern and next steps if it is not rectified. A second letter will be sent if an Attendance Improvement Plan is required, a meeting date and time will be provided on the letter.

Thank you for your continued support in ensuring that each student at St Peter's Catholic College reaches their full potential. Students will be leanring up until the final day of school, please ensure your child attends each day when not unwell. Holidays during school term needs permission from the principal, for illness and misadventure to apply to assessments. These days count in the attendance rate. It is discouraged for your child to miss school for family holidays during the school term, however, Mr Hilderbrandt will review each application based on individual circumstances. Please contact your Child's Leader of Wellbeing for support if your child is having difficulty coming to school.

St Cecilia Relic

As a College, St Peter's is lucky enough to have contact with two local Parishes - Wyong and The Entrance. Wyong Parish have been blessed with the gift of an extremely important and rare relic by a relative of the Parish.

Over the next twelve months a Parish Committee will be working to prepare a Reliquary for our relic of St Cecilia. The final step in this process will culminate on 22 November 2024.

Why is this process so important?

It is very important everyone understands the significance of this process. Three questions need to be answered to help in this understanding.

- 1. What is a Relic? A relic is the tangible remains of a saint, or any object that has been in contact with the saint.
- 2. What is a Reliquary? A reliquary is the container that stores and displays the relic.
- 3. Why do we venerate relics? Relics are physical, tangible, and concrete reminders that heaven is obtainable for us. We express gratitude to God for those members of our spiritual family as we recall their holy lives, ask for their intercession, and pray to achieve what they have achieved—eternity with God in Heaven.

What is the St Cecilia Relic?

Our relic of St Cecilia is described as sacred pearls from the veil of blood and its authenticity has been signed and sealed. The relic was donated to the parish by a parishioner's relative who visited St. Cecilia's, Wyong for her weekend Mass when she was in the area.

Why is our Church named in honour of St Cecilia?

Our Church was named in memory of Cecilia Ann Woodbury.

Cecilia was a young woman who was highly respected in the town of Wyong in its early days. She raised much of the money necessary for the building of the church but died at the young age of 33, on 27 April 1905.

What will be happening in our parish over the next month?

The Church bulletins for the next three weeks will record the life St Cecilia and at the 9:30 am Mass on Sunday 26 November, the official launch of our journey will commence. We would like to extend an invitation to all St Peter's families and community to attend the Mass to commemorate the beginning of such an exciting journey.

School Student Travel

Term 4 2023

2024 school travel applications are now open

Students who need a new or replacement School Opal card or travel pass for 2024 can <u>apply</u> now. A new application will need to be submitted if they are applying for the first time, or if they are requesting an additional travel entitlement because of a new shared parental arrangement (e.g. joint custody).

Students who change address, school, campus location, have repeated a year or received an expiry notification for their school travel entitlement should renew or update their details before the end of term 4. This will ensure that schools can endorse applications, and travel passes remain valid for the start of the 2024 school year. School Opal card holders will have the changes applied to their existing card.

If a student's distance eligibility has changed based on their grade (i.e. grade two to grade three), the system will automatically update their entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new eligibility criteria, we will send an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition that is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

<u>Term Bus Pass</u> holders will receive a notification to reapply.

Students in the Opal network applying for an Opal card (including a Term Bus Pass) for the first time will receive their Student Opal card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2024.

Students living in rural and regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the start of the new school year from their nominated transport operator. It may come via the school or be sent directly to them at home. Note: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes.

Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

Changes to your bus service provider

Within Greater Sydney, a number of bus service providers have changed their names.

Parents intending to lodge an application for a School Opal card will need to visit <u>transportnsw.info</u> <u>trip planner</u> to obtain the correct bus operator name servicing your area prior to lodging an application.

Travel from Term 1 2024

We ask that parents plan ahead and make sure their child knows which service/s to use and has a valid ticket to travel; either a School Opal card or Child/Youth Opal card (within Greater Sydney), or a School Travel Pass (outside Greater Sydney), from the start of the school year.

Applications for 2024 School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) travel open at the start of Term 4 2023, so parents/students can <u>apply</u> or <u>update</u> details early and be ready for the start of the new school year.

Most students using the Opal network will not need a new Opal card and can continue travelling on their existing card each year.

The start of the year is a busy period for local transport operators, and students travelling without a valid ticket make service planning and operations difficult.


We recognise that for some families last minute changes to school enrolments mean they may not have a School Opal card or Travel Pass for the start of term. In the Opal network, we strongly encourage these families to have their children travel with a Child/Youth Opal card until they receive their valid School Opal card. If outside Greater Sydney, parents should contact their <u>local bus operator</u> to discuss their travel needs.

Bus operators are flexible and understanding, particularly at the start of the school year, and will ensure students can travel safely to and from school. But to best support our operators we encourage all students to have a valid ticket, as early as possible, from the start of the school year.

Students using School Opal cards are also reminded that they must tap on and tap off in line with the Student code of conduct and Opal terms of use.
