EMPOWERING YOUTH IN THE DIGITAL AGE: UNDERSTANDING & ADOLESCENT GAMBLING

Dear Parents, Carers, Staff and Students

There are so many distractions that our young people must manage in their lives and recently there has been more frequent reports of young people engaging in online gambling. While we are not seeing too many issues arising at school relating to gambling, it is important for us, as adults, that we are aware of the temptations that our young people must navigate each day and equipped to support them in these areas.

The digital era has made gambling more accessible, and certain factors are elevating the risk of problematic gambling among young people. A new grey area is emerging, with smartphones at their fingertips blurring the boundaries between gambling and entertainment, especially within the realms of video games and social media. The current generation of young people are growing up in an unprecedented time and research highlights that a significant percentage of adolescents are involved in gambling activities.

Reports of young people gambling are frequent with many experiencing adverse consequences such as diminished academic performance and strained relationships. Today's youth are growing up in a digital age characterised by constant connectivity, and the gambling industry has evolved significantly during their formative years.

Simulated gambling, such as in video games, can further increase the likelihood of teenagers transitioning to real-money gambling and developing future gambling-related problems.

It's crucial to foster open discussions about positive media choices to help children navigate through responsible online gaming and gambling. By encouraging a balanced approach to screen time and promoting alternative activities, will help set some clear boundaries to avoid potential gambling-related issues.

St Cecilia's Reliquary

On the auspicious day of November 26th, I, alongside Mr. Little, and Jo Helm, had the distinct privilege of being accompanied by Chloe M., the School Captain of SPCC, to the solemn Mass held at St. Cecilia's Church in Wyong. This significant occasion marked the Official Launch and the reverential process of installing a Relic of St. Cecilia within the sacred confines of the Church.

The inception of this momentous journey dates back to May 2023, when Fr. Raul initiated the intricate process by seeking the discernment of authenticity from Bishop Anthony. This inquiry was a pivotal step in ensuring the sanctity and reverence befitting the Relic of St. Cecilia, a cherished emblem of spiritual significance.

Our presence at this sacred ceremony was not only a testament to the deep-rooted connection between SPCC and the broader community but also a reflection of our collective commitment to preserving and honouring the rich traditions embedded in the fabric of St. Cecilia's Church. As witnesses to the unfolding of this sacred event, we felt a profound sense of honour and gratitude for being entrusted with the responsibility of participating in the installation of such a revered relic.

The journey from the initial inquiry to the culminating Mass showcased the harmonious collaboration between the clergy, school leadership, and the wider community. It was a manifestation of unity, faith, and a shared commitment to upholding the spiritual heritage that St. Cecilia's Church embodies.

St Cecilia

St. Cecilia is recognised as the patroness of music and musicians and holds a special place in the hearts of Catholics around the world. Her life, steeped in devotion to God and a belief that she heard heavenly music during moments of intense prayer, has made her a revered figure in the Catholic Church.

St. Cecilia lived during the third century in Rome, a period marked by religious persecution under the Roman Emperor Marcus Aurelius. Born into a noble Roman family, she was known for her deep Christian faith from a young age. Despite her arranged marriage to a pagan named Valerian, Cecilia maintained her commitment to her Christian beliefs.

One of the most well-known stories about St. Cecilia centres around her marriage to Valerian. According to legend, on her wedding day, Cecilia sang in her heart to God, expressing her desire to remain chaste. She is said to have experienced a profound spiritual connection with God, which even the music of the instruments and the voices of the musicians could not drown out. After converting her husband Valerian and his brother Tiburtius to Christianity, they were all arrested for their beliefs. Eventually, she was beheaded, and her death marked her entry into sainthood. The Catholic Church celebrates the feast day of St. Cecilia on November 22nd. On this day, believers honour her life, martyrdom, and the contributions she made to the Christian faith. St. Cecilia's legacy in the Catholic Church endures through her association with music, unwavering faith, and martyrdom. As the patroness of musicians, she continues to inspire artists to use their talents in the service of God. Her life serves as a testament to the enduring power of faith and the transformative nature of devotion to God in the face of adversity. St. Cecilia remains an iconic figure, weaving together the realms of spirituality and artistic expression in the Catholic tradition.



Applications are now open for 2024 Student Opal cards on Transport for NSW website. We encourage parents and carers to apply now to make sure their children receive their School Opal card before the start of the 2024 new school year.

Getting to school by bus in 2024

Will your child be catching the bus to school next year? Applications are now open for a 2024 School Opal cards. As it's a busy time of year, we highly recommend you make this application before the end of this year. It's also good to check the bus timetable to make your child's journey to school as easy as possible. Here is how it works:

School Opal cards

- All students catching the bus in 2024 will need a School Opal card.
- Under the <u>School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS)</u>, eligible students can apply for free or subsided travel between home and school.
- For more information about the SSTS and how to apply for a School Opal Card, visit https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/#/ from a desktop computer, and click 'apply for a school travel pass'.

Bus timetables

Busways is the school bus operator that runs your schools' bus services. To find your child's school bus timetable visit the Busways website by using the following steps:

- 1. Go to busways.com.au/nsw
- 2. Click on 'school services' in the navigation bar and then proceed to 'school timetables'
- 3. Enter the school's name in the field that says 'enter a school name'
- 4. Select the school's name and the timetable should open on your device.
- 5. If you are unable to find or search for the school's name, use the drop-down menus on the same web page to find the
- 6. Once the timetable is opened, you will be able to identify which school bus services are available in your area for your child to use.
