It focuses on the learning for every student which combined with our contemporary learning environment challenges our students to be the very best they can be. Learning Support

Learning Support performs the vital role of support, guidance and assistance for students with specific learning needs and disabilities within the College. Learning Support takes the form of specific programs, as well as group and individual assistance. There is a substantial amount of support and coteaching done in the classroom setting. A specific diagnosis of a "learning difference" is required to access assistance from the qualified Learning Support Staff.

High Potential and Gifted Education

St Peter's is committed to the education of High Potential and Gifted (HPG) students. We provide rich opportunities for students identified across the intellectual, creative, social-emotional, and physical domains.

Our HPG Program identifies students with high potential or giftedness across one or more domains and places them with like-minded students so that their learning is relevant, extended and differentiated to meet them at their current level of challenge.

Our HPG Teachers are specially trained, highly experienced, and passionate about providing specific adjustments or interventions such as curriculum compaction, furthering depth and complexity, programming with a conceptual framework for abstraction, and potential acceleration while ensuring that student social and emotional wellbeing is nurtured.

Students identified as Twice Exceptional are Case Managed in collaboration with the Learning Support Team so that diagnosed neurodivergence and/or disability is not a barrier for a High Potential or Gifted student in them reaching their potential.

Sport

St Peter's have extensive sporting facilities with an oval, playing fields, basketball and netball courts. We are proud to celebrate the considerable successes of our sporting teams across a wide range of sports including swimming, athletics, cross country, basketball, netball, tennis, rugby, touch football and rugby league.

Representative sport is undertaken at Diocesan level. Sport is actively promoted as encouraging sportsmanship and social development in meeting other students from a cross section of schools in a friendly but competitive atmosphere.

OUR WELLBEING

Our Wellbeing team is driven to enhance the wellbeing of all our students by addressing their diverse needs and challenges. We are a collaborative team integrating various programs and resources to support students in their academic, emotional, and social growth. Our Wellbeing approach is designed on the principles of holistic development, providing students with access to personalised support, self-help resources, group programs and a community of peers and mentors to support students through difficult times and celebrate their successes. Our Wellbeing hub offers respite throughout the day, when students need timeout, to seek support or information to support their wellbeing.

Our Approach


- Provide students with access to a wide range of self-care resources and tools to support their academic, emotional, and social wellbeing.
- Foster a sense of community and belonging among students, enabling them to connect with peers and mentors who can provide support and guidance.
- Facilitate collaboration between students, educators, and mental health professionals to create a supportive environment for students.
- External provider incursions providing students with practical skills in dealing with cyber bullying, bullying, mental health and physical health challenges, sleep, effective study skills and gaming addiction.
- Our close relationship with the Youth Engagement Officer (NSW Police) provides timely presentations and individual talks concerning anti-social behaviours, safe partying, and driving.
- School dogs work with individual students to lower anxiety levels in the classroom, during vaccinations, playground and excursions.

Student Leader Program

We understand that in today's world everybody needs good leadership skills. We offer programs to allow students to develop a range of these skills. Students in Years 7 – 10 participate in targeted cross-curricular projects which aim to promote College spirit while learning how to effectively collaborate, communicate and persuasively present their ideas. We boast a young entrepreneurs club where students from all ages are guided in developing and promoting their own small businesses.

Our Student Representative Council for students in Years 7 – 11 empowers our students to have a voice in the daily running of the College as well as the longer-term school improvement agenda. Our senior leadership program commences in Year 11 and successful leaders are trained in various aspects of leadership including the importance of vision and leading through service to others.

We aim to expand the minds of students and prepare them to work effectively within a diverse community while developing an understanding of the opportunities and methodologies that drive innovative thinking.














